Empowering youth and educators to take action on climate change!

Are you ready to take climate action in your school, community, and beyond? Through StopWaste’s educational programs, Alameda County K-12 school teachers can partner with us to bring environmental awareness and climate action to your school. These programs inspire and empower young people to become changemakers by developing action projects that address upstream waste prevention and climate change.

Through these programs, students will:

- **Learn** and practice the 4Rs – Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, and Rot.
- **Engage** in environmental and climate topics aligned with district environmental and climate literacy goals.
- **Transform** from garbologists (people who study garbage) to action heroes and ambassadors, developing and implementing action projects that create the change they want to see on their school campus.

4th Grade | Transfer Station Field Trips



Take a guided tour of a functioning transfer station to learn first hand about the journey of waste and what happens to our recyclables, garbage, and compostables. Students will learn ways to reduce waste and conserve natural resources through the 4Rs. Free bus transportation provided.

5th-12th Grade | 4Rs Climate Action Project



Bring climate education and action to your classroom or club! Our experienced educators will facilitate a project-based learning program that will engage your students in meaningful ways. Through a climate action project, your students will develop their leadership skills while working towards making a positive impact in their school.

9th-12th Grade | StopWaste Ambassador Project



Engage the young leaders at your school. This program is a two-year leadership program to support student groups who are taking on climate action projects in their school community.

K-12th Grade | Virtual 4Rs Field Trips



Participate online. In this one-hour interactive program, StopWaste educators “Zoom” into your classroom to share with students the journey of waste and the importance of the 4Rs.
