Used Batteries & Motor Oil

Food Waste Collection

Use a kitchen food pail, other reusable containers, or collect with paper bags or newspaper, then dispose into green waste cart.

FOOD SCRAPS COLLECTION

All food products, including meat and bones and food-soiled paper such as pizza boxes, paper towels, paper plates, paper napkins and waxed paper containers should be placed into your green waste cart for weekly curbside collection.

AS EASY AS 1-2-3!



Sort food scraps and food-soiled paper from trash and recyclables.



Use a kitchen food pail, other reusable containers, or collect with paper bags or newspaper.



Empty into the green waste cart. Paper bags and newspaper can be thrown directly into green waste cart.

No liquid, plastic, glass, metal or foam products

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

HHW (i.e. household hazardous waste such as paints, pesticides, fertilizers, compact fluorescent lights (CFLs), electronics, propane tanks and cleaners) is not allowed in the trash, recycling or green waste containers. INFORMATION

ORO LOMA SANITARY DISTRICT (OLSD) is a public agency that provides wastewater services to approximately 46,000 households and 1,000 businesses. OLSD also oversees the solid waste collection services provided by Waste Management of Alameda County (a private company). To learn more about OLSD, visit: www.oroloma.org

WASTE MANAGEMENT OF ALAMEDA COUNTY (also known as WM or WMAC) collects solid waste: trash, recycling, and green waste as the designated waste hauler for OLSD and many cities in Alameda County.

Call Waste Management for missed service, billing questions, container repair and replacement, and to add or reduce solid waste services.

SERVICE INFORMATION

- Place carts 2 feet apart on the street with wheels against the curb by 6 a.m. on collection day. Do not place carts on sidewalks or block driveways.
- All materials must fit in the carts with the lids closed. The fee for overfilling a trash cart is the monthly trash rate divided by 2.5.
- All recyclables must fit inside cart with lid closed. Call Waste Management for a larger or additional recycling cart at no additional cost.
- · Cart sizes:
 - Trash: 20, 32, 64 or 96 gallon
 - Recycling: 64 or 96 gallon
 - Green Waste: 64 or 96 gallon

DELAYED SOLID WASTE SERVICE

Observed Holidays: Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year's Day. When a holiday falls on a weekday, service will be delayed by one day for the week.

OTHER SERVICES

BULKY PICKUP

Call (510) 613-8710 to schedule a bulky pickup

- · Entitled to two bulky pickups per calendar year at no additional cost.
- · Up to 3 large residential appliances, and
- · Up to 4 passenger vehicle tires, no rims, and
- · Up to 3 large household items, including furniture and mattresses, and
- · Yard trimmings and wood pieces (not to exceed 4 feet), and
- · Up to 2 cubic yards of trash and small appliances



HOLIDAY TREE PICKUP

Trees are picked up curbside during the first two weeks of January, on your regular pickup day. Only clean trees will be collected. Please ensure your tree is free of "snow" flocking, stands, lights and decorations. Trees longer than 6 feet must be cut.



BACKYARD COLLECTION

Carts can be collected from backyards for an additional fee, or no fee for qualifying disabled individuals. Call (510) 613-8710 for details.
