# **BACKGROUND**

Section 64.130 (Q)(1)(b) of the Alameda County Charter requires that full written disclosure of ex parte communications be entered in the Recycling Board's official record. At the June 19, 1991 meeting of the Recycling Board, the Board approved the recommendation of Legal Counsel that such reports be placed on the consent calendar as a way of entering them into the Board's official record. The Board at that time also requested that staff develop a standard form for the reporting of such communications. A standard form for the reporting of ex parte communications has since been developed and distributed to Board members.

At the December 9, 1999 meeting of the Recycling Board, the Board adopted the following language:

Ex parte communication report forms should be submitted only for ex parte communications that are made after the matter has been put on the Recycling Board's agenda, giving as much public notice as possible.

Per the previously adopted policy, all such reports received will be placed on the consent calendar of the next regularly scheduled Recycling Board meeting.

SUBJECT: Alameda County Food Recovery Network & Edible Food Recovery Reporting Updates

#### **SUMMARY**

For the past decade, StopWaste has strengthened partnerships with food recovery organizations to better understand their needs. As part of this effort, StopWaste regularly convenes the Alameda County Food Recovery Network, a diverse group of organizations committed to recovering and donating surplus edible food. At the July 11 board meeting, staff will provide an overview of the network, share the results from the 2023 Edible Food Recovery Report, and highlight how the network supports efforts to address food insecurity and reduce wasted food in Alameda County.

# **DISCUSSION**

StopWaste formed the Alameda County Food Recovery Network three years ago to help support SB 1383 edible food recovery implementation requirements and expand capacity and food recovery coordination in the county. The network includes a wide range of food recovery organizations and other community groups (faith-based organizations, housing agencies, etc.), all working to help facilitate the rescue and redistribution of edible surplus food in Alameda County (see list of organizations attached). The network is united by a common goal to ensure that surplus edible food is put to its highest and best use—to nourish communities. The network provides a space for over 50 participating organizations to collaborate, connect, and build relationships to strengthen the county's food recovery landscape.

SB 1383 requires food recovery organizations that recover donated food from large Tier 1 and Tier 2 commercial edible food generators to report the amount recovered annually to their local jurisdiction. StopWaste assists all jurisdictions in Alameda County with collecting this data to help standardize the report countywide. The jurisdictions then report this information to CalRecycle. During the presentation, staff will present results from these recovery efforts.

**SUBJECT:** Reuse and Repair Circular Economy Overview

#### **SUMMARY**

A healthy circular economy minimizes waste and maximizes the efficiency of materials and resources by keeping them in circulation through upstream waste prevention, redesign, reuse, repair, and repurposing. StopWaste helps shape our local reuse and repair economy in Alameda County and the region through a number of ways, including grant support to upstream organizations and businesses to advance infrastructure, policy advocacy and leadership, and convening stakeholders to strengthen partnerships within the reuse and repair industry. At the July 11 meeting, staff will present an overview of the reuse and repair landscape and provide an update on new laws to support the effort and share stories from our reuse and repair partner network.

#### **DISCUSSION**

StopWaste formed the Bay Area Reuse and Repair Network five years ago to develop a pathway for businesses and nonprofits involved in reuse, repair, and redistribution to connect, share resources and ideas, create partnerships, and foster the expansion of the industry and strengthen the upstream movement. StopWaste convenes the network quarterly, which is currently made up of over 75 diverse organizations working to strengthen the circular economy in our region.

StopWaste grant recipients and network members are involved in projects and programs that both help reduce waste as well as improve the health and resilience of the communities where they live and work. Recently passed state legislation such as the California's landmark Right to Repair law and extended producer responsibility laws like SB 54, have the potential to help drive the circular economy infrastructure and systems needed to spur a thriving reuse and repair landscape.
